


DURING THE WAR OF 1812, A CIRCULAR 180' EARTHEN ARTILLERY REDOUBT WAS ERECTED AS A DEFENSE FOR FORT MCHENRY, ON SEPTEMBER 13, 1814, LT. 






36 CFR Part 800: Protection of Historic Properties Implementing Regulations










Section 106 - Getting Started

A project, activity, or program that uses state or federal funds or that requires a state or federal permit or license

Project Types Subject to Review

- Construction
- Demolition

- Ancillary Activities
- Wetland Mitigation





- Continue consultation
- Notify the ACHP
- Involve consulting parties
- Provide documentation to all consulting parties
 - Involve the public
 - Develop MOA
- Proceed with project

Section 106 - Role of the MHT/ MD SHPO


- Key participant in consultation
- Ensure compliance with historic preservation legislation
- Assist in identifying historic properties potentially affected by an undertaking
- Assess the undertaking's effects on the properties
- Seek ways to avoid, minimize or mitigate any adverse effects
- SHPO is both a resource agency and a facilitator







Section 106: Tips for Success

Example of successful early coordination – Multi-Year Work Plan: MHT reviewed 127 proposed undertakings – only 4 had the potential to impact significant historic properties and required further coordination.


